# Invest in biodiversity

Save lives and money, and address climate change

Governments and other entities around the globe have spent a lot of time, money and energy addressing the health and economic consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic and coming up with medical and economic solutions. These actions are necessary, as so many people's lives and livelihoods have been lost or are gravely threatened.

Applying a similar sense of urgency, the world's leaders would be wise to also direct more attention and resources to the root cause of the emergence of zoonotic pandemics: human disturbance of nature.

Unsustainable exploitation of the environment—through land-use change, agricultural expansion and intensification, wildlife trade and consumption, and other drivers—is the source of almost all pandemics, according to a 2020 report from a gathering of experts on biodiversity and pandemics convened by the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES).

The resulting costs are astounding. First, of course, is the human toll—1.9 million deaths from COVID-19 alone as of January 2021. Many more have suffered serious illness and lasting symptoms. The monetary cost of the current pandemic also grows daily. By July 2020, the costs were estimated at US\$8 trillion to \$16 trillion globally, according to the IPBES report, costs that have surely climbed exponentially since then.



Unsustainable exploitation of the environment—through land-use change, agricultural expansion and intensification, wildlife trade and consumption, and other drivers—is the source of almost all pandemics.

The IPBES report estimates a markedly lower cost of US\$22 billion to US\$31.2 billion for the implementation of global strategies to prevent pandemics. These strategies include reducing wildlife trade and land-use change and increasing surveillance of human, animal and environmental health via the One Health multiple-sector initiative.

There is already action on many of these fronts. Organizations around the globe have long worked to halt wildlife trafficking and encouraged governments and communities to sustainably manage natural areas and conserve crucial habitats. Recently, a coalition of public health and environmental organizations—including CEPF founding donor Conservation International and CEPF conservation partners World Resources Institute and Wildlife Conservation Society—formed Preventing Pandemics at the Source to apply a more holistic approach to the pandemic threat, pursuing policies, awareness and funding for preventative action.

The global community is, however, still falling short when it comes to allocating the resources required for these types of practical actions to be taken well before a crisis such as the current pandemic.

CEPF's grantees and other civil society organizations continue their efforts to conserve the world's biodiversity and prevent the environmental conditions that enable zoonotic diseases. They have proven methods for protecting and restoring habitats that provide a buffer between humans and wild animals and offer other vital services such as fresh water, clean air and food. Many organizations are collaborating with governments to thwart the dangerous and often illegal trade in wild animals. These groups are among the heroes in the struggle against pandemics.

For a relatively low cost, the international community can empower these champions of a healthy world by significantly increasing the resources devoted to conserving biodiversity. With appropriate levels of funding, the return on investment for the global community includes fewer pandemics, healthier water, richer soils, climate regulation and much more—it's an incredible bargain.


## Participatory priority-setting:

CEPF partners with a regional implementation team in the hotspot to help shepherd the investment and build local conservation leadership.

Civil society entities—including nongovernmental organizations, communities, Indigenous peoples groups, universities and small businesses—apply for grants that are awarded on a competitive basis for projects that contribute to CEPF's conservation strategy.

Projects funded by CEPF add up to a portfolio of complementary conservation actions addressing critical priorities while also building local conservation communities that will continue to lead protection of the hotspots after CEPF funding is completed.

The results achieved by CEPF grantees complement governments' efforts to meet targets related to the U.N.'s Convention on Biological Diversity (the Aichi Targets), Framework Convention on Climate Change, and Sustainable Development Goals.



## A Healthy Future Requires a Biodiverse World

As a Costa Rican and former minister of environment for the country, I am passionately proud of Costa Rica's role as a global leader in conservation and sustainable development. Our people understood early on that nature and human well-being go hand in hand—that you don't have to choose one or the other.

I first heard of the Critical Ecosystem Partnership Fund in 2003, when I was serving as minister of environment. I was informed by Conservation International's Costa Rica office that CEPF wanted to contribute to conserving the Mesoamerica Biodiversity Hotspot through grants to civil society, supporting projects that would help the countries of the hotspot, including Costa Rica, to implement their conservation plans. And I learned that the fund's grant-making was organized around a science-based, stakeholder-driven strategy in the form of its ecosystem profile. I could see that was an innovative and promising approach.

At that time, Costa Rica was ahead of most countries in valuing and acting on conservation, and was one of the first countries in the developing world to have a strategy for addressing conservation gaps—areas of high biodiversity lying outside the protected-area system. Costa Rica also was unusual in that the government was already collaborating with civil society organizations to implement conservation. But we were happy to gain a new partner in these pursuits.

The cooperative efforts among CEPF, CEPF's civil-society grantees and the government proved very successful, and CEPF became part of the groundbreaking effort that Costa Rica initiated to consolidate, amplify and change the economics around nature conservation. When you consider Costa Rica's conservation success story, you need to see CEPF inside that story.

It was clear to me back in the early days of my acquaintance with CEPF that other countries, particularly those with less-developed conservation communities, needed such a partner. The trust and collaboration that CEPF nurtures between civil society and government is beneficial to all involved. And since that time, CEPF has expanded its reach, having provided US\$255 million to nearly 2,500 grantees in 98 of the developing and transitional countries and territories of the world's biodiversity hotspots. Results from those grants include more than 15 million hectares of protected area, more than 50 million hectares of Key Biodiversity Areas with strengthened management, and support to more than 900 species on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species.

Now, from my view as CEO and chairperson of the Global Environment Facility (GEF)—one of CEPF's six global donors—the need is even clearer and more urgent. This year, we may have a landmark political decision to protect 30% of the world's oceans and land, a target that is expected to emerge from the 2021 conference of the parties of the U.N. Convention on Biological Diversity.

This goal is intended to not only address the current biodiversity crisis, but also the climate crisis, as it is estimated that protecting, restoring and sustainably managing natural ecosystems could account for at least 30% of global action needed to avoid the worst climate scenarios. It also has everything to do with the global recovery from COVID-19—an extreme example of what can result from humans disrupting nature's integrity.

Achieving this worthy goal requires not just more funding, but also focus on conservation approaches that have proven effective. We know what has worked and what hasn't, and based on that knowledge, we need to make strategic investments. In that context, the GEF looks at CEPF as a strong partner with successful methods for empowering civil society's contribution to conservation.

While this is a time of uncertainty, loss and tremendous challenge, it also presents an opportunity for what we call a green-blue recovery—that is, one based on conserving ecosystems on land and in the oceans. Supporting grassroots conservation must be part of building back better. The GEF is ready and eager to collaborate with CEPF and other partners to help the world's governments meet global environmental obligations and construct a stable, healthy, nature-based future for their people.

## CEPF AND GLOBAL TARGETS

CEPF-funded projects contribute to many of the U.N. targets for biodiversity and sustainable development.

### UN Convention on Biological Diversity Aichi Targets

#### TARGET \ 1

By 2020, at the latest, people are aware of the values of biodiversity and the steps they can take to conserve and use it sustainably.



#### TARGET \ 2

By 2020, at the latest, biodiversity values have been integrated into national and local development and poverty reduction strategies and planning processes and are being incorporated into national accounting, as appropriate, and reporting systems.



#### TARGET \ 3

By 2020, at the latest, incentives, including subsidies, harmful to biodiversity are eliminated, phased out or reformed in order to minimize or avoid negative impacts, and positive incentives for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity are developed and applied, consistent and in harmony with the Convention and other relevant international obligations, taking into account national socioeconomic conditions.



#### TARGET \ 4

By 2020, at the latest, governments, business and stakeholders at all levels have taken steps to achieve or have implemented plans for sustainable production and consumption and have kept the impacts of use of natural resources well within safe ecological limits.



#### TARGET \ 7

By 2020, areas under agriculture, aquaculture and forestry are managed sustainably, ensuring conservation of biodiversity.



#### TARGET \ 9

By 2020, invasive alien species and pathways are identified and prioritized, priority species are controlled or eradicated, and measures are in place to manage pathways to prevent their introduction and establishment.



#### TARGET \ 11

By 2020, at least 17 percent of terrestrial and inland water, and 10 percent of coastal and marine areas, especially areas of particular importance for biodiversity and ecosystem services, are conserved through effectively and equitably managed, ecologically representative and well-connected systems of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures and integrated into the wider landscapes and seascapes.



#### TARGET \ 12

By 2020, the extinction of known threatened species has been prevented and their conservation status, particularly of those most in decline, has been improved and sustained.



#### TARGET \ 20

By 2020, at the latest, the mobilization of financial resources for effectively implementing the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011–2020 from all sources, and in accordance with the consolidated and agreed process in the Strategy for Resource Mobilization, should increase substantially from the current levels. This target will be subject to changes contingent to resource needs assessments to be developed and reported by Parties.

## Guinean Forests mid-term meeting

» CEPF's current five-year, US\$10.1 million investment in the Guinean Forests of West Africa Biodiversity Hotspot celebrated its halfway point by gathering grantees to discuss progress, priorities, lessons and opportunities.

Participants from 34 CEPF grantees from eight countries came together—along with CEPF staff and regional implementation team members—in Monrovia, Liberia, for a three-day workshop. Representatives of CEPF's global donors also attended the event.

The primary focus of the workshop was the concept of “mainstreaming” biodiversity conservation into public policies and the private sector, an important part of CEPF's strategy for the hotspot. A concurrent two-day workshop was held with stakeholders, including representatives from the government, donors, and the mining and forestry commodities sectors. Grantees had the opportunity to meet with these stakeholders to discuss working together.

## First Indigenous and Community Conserved Area in Brazil

» The Kalunga Quilombo community became Brazil's first Indigenous and Community Conserved Area through the efforts of Associação Quilombo Kalunga, a CEPF grantee in the Cerrado Biodiversity Hotspot.

It is difficult for traditional communities to gain recognition of their territories in Brazil, leaving them vulnerable to land grabs. This designation provides protections for the 260,000-hectare territory that is shared by 1,600 families. The community has committed to conserving the incredible biodiversity found on their land.

## New Ph.D. adds to Comoros' conservation leadership

» Amelaid Houmadi, the Comorian ecology team leader for CEPF grantee Dahari, successfully defended his Ph.D. at the Université of d'Antananarivo, Madagascar, on the topic of terrestrial conservation priorities on the island of Anjouan, Comoros. The Ph.D. research was funded by CEPF through its investment in the Madagascar and Indian Ocean Islands Biodiversity Hotspot, and used data collected during a related project. There are few doctorates in the field of ecology in the Comoros, making this an important result for the country.

The analysis of species distribution and suitable habitat modelling for key animal species on Anjouan enabled the identification of areas important for the conservation of endangered endemic birds, reptiles and mammals. The final results identified a conservation priority area that covered 22.6% of the total area of the island. The resulting maps allow stakeholders to decide where and how to act to conserve biodiversity, and are a key tool for decision-making on reforestation activities and agroforestry management.

Dahari has been working in the Moya Forest area on Anjouan to establish a landscape management model for livelihood development and biodiversity conservation in conjunction with local communities.

## Twelve new amphibian species discovered

» In the Tropical Andes Biodiversity Hotspot, CEPF-funded field studies conducted in southern Ecuador by Universidad Técnica Particular de Loja had exciting results. In the 6.6-hectare Abra de Zamora Key Biodiversity Area, researchers found

27 amphibian species, 12 of which were new to science. A single place with such high amphibian diversity is rare. The findings led to discussions with local stakeholders and, ultimately, the inclusion of Abra de Zamora in the declaration of a new municipal protected area for biodiversity and watershed conservation for the city of Loja.

## Adjusting to help after cyclone

► Tropical Cyclone Harold made landfall as a Category 5 storm on Vanuatu's Espiritu Santo Island on 6 April. A third of the country's 270,000 people were affected, and on many islands, more than half of the dwellings were damaged. CEPF amended two active grants, to Live & Learn Vanuatu and the Edenhope Foundation, respectively, to enable them to deliver support for the rebuilding of water supply systems and emergency shelters.

## Grantees help communities facing pandemic

» The COVID-19 pandemic required the CEPF Secretariat, its regional implementation teams and its grantees to work together to address the unprecedented situation. The Tropical Andes Biodiversity Hotspot provides several examples of such efforts.

- Along the Ecuador-Colombia border, Indigenous communities have had longstanding issues with drug traffickers and illegal gold miners and have suffered violence and murder. The pandemic introduced yet another threat. CEPF partnered with three Awá indigenous organizations—the Unidad Indígena del Pueblo Awá, the Resguardo Pialapí Pueblo Viejo and Centro Awá Pambilar—to help protect the communities. With CEPF support, the communities obtained COVID-19 personal protective equipment, secured communications devices to strengthen coordination, and received information in the Awapit language on how to prevent the spread of the virus. A highpoint was the installation of a radio antenna at La Planada Nature Reserve that allowed the transmission of internet and cell phone signals to Awá communities, which is indispensable for securing the territory and emergency communications.
- In Peru, CEPF grantee Practical Action had been working to protect threatened bird species in the district of San José de Lourdes but shifted to providing seeds and food packages to the isolated community.
- A small grant to Awajún Indigenous authorities managing the Chayu Nain Communal Reserve in northern Peru allowed communities to obtain disinfectant, masks and other supplies as well as fishing equipment.


Other grantees used CEPF funds to purchase sanitary supplies and equipment for their offices to prevent the spread of the virus.

## Mountains of Central Asia conservation moves ahead

» As part of a five-year, US\$8 million investment in the Mountains of Central Asia Biodiversity Hotspot, CEPF's regional implementation team (RIT), led by WWF-Russia, issued the first calls for letters of inquiry for projects in Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan. By the end of the fiscal year (30 June), the RIT was in negotiations to award 13 small grants and was reviewing 45 large-grant applications.

## Eastern Afromontane investment completed

» CEPF completed its investment in the Eastern Afromontane Biodiversity Hotspot after seven years and nearly US\$12 million awarded in grants to organizations in 13 countries. CEPF funds reached 115 grantees, 85 of which are based in the region.

Results included:

- Improved management of 58 Key Biodiversity Areas covering 4.8 million hectares.
- Within that total, created or expanded 11 protected areas covering 1.4 million hectares.
- Reduced threats to 27 globally threatened species and discovered six new ones.
- Provided non-cash benefits—such as access to clean water and improved food security—to more than 200,000 people.
- Increased the income of more than 26,000 people from livelihood activities such as beekeeping and sustainable agriculture.

## First grants made from CEPF to civil society in Palestine

» As part of its conservation efforts in the Mediterranean Basin Biodiversity Hotspot, CEPF made its first-ever grant awards to organizations in Palestine—the Palestinian Wildlife Society and Nature Palestine Society. Palestine is home to 14 Key Biodiversity Areas. The projects focus on protecting threatened plants.

## Indo-Burma: One investment complete and new one planned

» A seven-year investment in the Indo-Burma Biodiversity Hotspot concluded with a total of US\$15.4 million in funding to 189 projects. Meanwhile, CEPF developed new ecosystem profile that assessed the current context for conservation and will guide future investment. Based on the new profile, the CEPF Donor Council approved in November 2020 a new five-year commitment of \$10 million for conservation of the hotspot.

Key impacts from the investment completed in 2020 include:

- Long-term conservation programs established for core populations of 31 priority species.
- Five pilot models for biodiversity-friendly production established, including rice farming, medicinal plant collection and cement manufacture.
- Benefits gained by 162 local communities, including improved land tenure, food security and access to ecosystem services such as fresh water and food.
- Protection and management strengthened for 1.4 million hectares within 55 Key Biodiversity Areas.
- Initiatives to reduce wildlife trafficking across the Cambodia-Vietnam, Lao PDR-Vietnam, Vietnam-China and Myanmar-China borders resulted in seizures of major shipments of ivory, pangolin scales and other illegally traded products, and public commitments by private companies of zero tolerance toward illegal wildlife trade.
- Establishment or strengthening of 51 civil society networks, enabling collective responses to priority and emerging threats.
- Strengthened capacity of 135 civil society organizations working on conservation.

CEPF's previous ecosystem profile for Indo-Burma was used by other funders to guide an additional US\$30 million for conservation.

## Loggerhead turtles have a boom year in Cabo Verde

▶ In Cabo Verde, part of the Mediterranean Basin Biodiversity Hotspot, the number of loggerhead turtles that came to shore and the number of nests reached record levels. More than 100,000 nests were counted in 2018 for the whole of Cabo Verde. The official 2020 count came in at over 170,000 nests.

In Sal and Santa Luzia, where CEPF supports partners Projeto Biodiversidad and Biosfera, more than 2,500 nests have been recorded. In addition, more than 88,000 nests were recorded on Boa Vista, where CEPF previously supported turtle conservation efforts.

Years of work by NGOs to protect the turtles and their nesting is believed to have played an important role in this growth.

## Five-year investment completed in Wallacea

▶ CEPF's US\$6.85 million investment in the Wallacea Biodiversity Hotspot, which consists of islands in the central part of Indonesia and Timor-Leste, came to a conclusion. The regional implementation team Burung Indonesia and the CEPF Secretariat awarded 109 grants to 68 organizations. Work took place in 43 Key Biodiversity Areas and provided benefits such as improved food security and access to fresh water to 169 communities.

Results include:

- Threats were reduced to 18 priority species.
- 258,000 terrestrial hectares and 1 million marine hectares were placed under formal protection.
- More than 521,000 hectares of forest and 36,000 hectares of fisheries are under improved management.

Burung engaged national government agencies, particularly for protected areas and for fisheries, and provincial governments with the message that CEPF grantees, working in relatively small areas, were doing work that would help the government achieve its own goals and that these investments could be built upon and the results multiplied tenfold. For example, several thousand hectares of marine protected areas created by grantees in Central Sulawesi became seeds for the provincial government's creation of the 876,000-hectare Banggai Dalaka Marine Protected Area.

## 2019-2020 new protections for biodiverse forests

November 2019

▶ As a result of Solomon Islands' forests being under severe threat from logging, the nation declared 800 hectares of Sirebe tribal land as the country's first protected area covering tropical forests. This tribal area is located in the Mount Maetambe-Kolombangara River Key Biodiversity Area (KBA), one of CEPF's priority sites in the East Melanesian Islands Biodiversity Hotspot. The area is home to 19 of the 21 frog species found in the Solomon Islands, as well as many bird, mammal and reptile species.

The Sirebe Tribe will also be the first tribe in the country to trade carbon credits. CEPF grantee Natural Resources Development Foundation (NRDF) has been working with the Sirebe Tribe to introduce the plan so that the community can sell carbon offsets and conservation credits, and switch from forest clearance

to a conservation model. CEPF has helped support the various tribes in the KBA since 2013 through the work of Ecological Solutions Solomon Islands and NRDF.

January 2020

▶ Peru's government announced the creation of the Bosque Montano de Carpish Regional Conservation Area. The conservation area will protect 50,559 hectares along the watershed of the Peruvian Amazon, home to an array of birds and to plant species that are native to Peru.

The effort to win the designation was spearheaded by CEPF grantee Nature and Culture International and local community leaders. Supporters are hopeful that the protected status will draw tourists and provide a source of revenue for local communities.


▶ The Myanmar government established 156,280-hectare Imawbum National Park. It protects the only known population of the Critically Endangered Myanmar snub-nosed monkey (*Rhinopithecus strykeri*), which was unknown to science until its discovery in 2010. The new park is the culmination of years of effort by Fauna & Flora International (FFI), in partnership with the Myanmar Forest Department and local communities. CEPF supported the community consultations and agricultural land mapping necessary to verify the boundary for the park. CEPF is supporting FFI and its partners to develop a management plan for the new park.

# James D. Wolfensohn





## Saying goodbye to one of CEPF's founders

James D. Wolfensohn, former World Bank president who was one of CEPF's founders, passed away on 25 November 2020 at age 86. Mr. Wolfensohn and Conservation International founder and former CEO Peter Seligmann launched CEPF in 2000, when Mr. Wolfensohn was president of the World Bank.

"Mr. Wolfensohn was essential to the establishment of CEPF," said Olivier Langrand, CEPF's executive director. "His sincere interest in making the world better combined with his keen understanding of finance, development and the role of civil society set CEPF and its grantees on a path to success. We owe him a debt of gratitude for his leadership and commitment to conservation."

Mr. Wolfensohn lived an exceptional life. From a modest upbringing in Australia, he rose to the top of international finance. He served as the president of the World Bank for 10 years, where he focused on poverty alleviation and waged a campaign against corruption. He was an Olympic fencer and an accomplished cellist, and he served as an officer in the Royal Australian Air Force. As chairman for New York's Carnegie Hall and Washington, D.C.'s Kennedy Center, he played an important role in strengthening the finances of the revered arts venues.

The idea for CEPF grew out of the friendship between Mr. Wolfensohn and Mr. Seligmann. During an interview CEPF conducted with the two men in July 2010, Mr. Seligmann said they met at a dinner hosted by actor Harrison Ford. "I was really attracted, Jim, to your personal interest and passion for doing the right thing and finding the right path, and I thought, here's someone who I could not only be a friend with, but someone who I could really partner with." On a subsequent fly-fishing trip in Wyoming, they formed the idea for a fund that would conserve the world's biodiversity hotspots and strengthen civil society. They founded CEPF with US\$25 million commitments each from the World Bank, Conservation International and the Global Environment Facility, and the partnership grew from there.

"I knew the idea of the partnership was important because for me, it was probably the first of the new visible partnerships I had with civil society, when the bank was wholly distrusted by civil society, and what I was trying to do was to say that it was much better if we worked together," said Mr. Wolfensohn in the July 2010 interview.

He went on to serve multiple terms as the chairperson for the CEPF Donor Council, helping to guide the fund through growth in its partnership and changes in the environmental threats and opportunities in the world's biodiversity hotspots.

He and his wife Elaine, who passed away in August 2020, were involved in many philanthropic and service endeavors, and their love of nature was reflected in their commitments, including Mr. Wolfensohn's service as board member and board member emeritus for Conservation International.

They will be missed, but their positive impact on the world will be felt for generations to come.



CEPF awards grants to civil society working on conservation in developing countries within the biodiversity hotspots.

There are 36 hotspots around the globe. Some are contained in a single country, such as Japan. Others include parts of several countries, such as the Mediterranean Basin Hotspot, which encompasses portions of 34 countries and territories.





## CEPF FINANCIAL SUMMARY


During the 2020 fiscal year of 1 July 2019 to 30 June 2020, CEPF awarded nearly US\$12.7 million in new grants, bringing the amount it has invested in conserving critical ecosystems since 2000 to more than US\$255 million.

CEPF received revenue from multiple new donor agreements during the fiscal year. In August 2019, CEPF signed a new funding agreement with the MAVA Foundation of US\$680,000 to support the Mediterranean Basin Biodiversity Hotspot. In November 2019, CEPF signed an agreement with the Margaret A. Cargill Philanthropies for US\$2.5 million to support the Indo-Burma Biodiversity Hotspot. CEPF signed two new funding agreements in December 2020 with l'Agence Française de Développement (AFD) for 12.2 million euros from the European Union, and for 14 million euros from AFD directly. And in June 2020, CEPF signed a 20,000-euro contract related to the finalization of the Green Climate Fund proposal that was under development related to the Madagascar and Indian Ocean Islands Biodiversity Hotspot.

By the end of the year, 2,492 grantees had received support from the fund since its inception. CEPF continued active granting in the Cerrado, East Melanesian Islands, Guinean Forests of West Africa, Madagascar and the Indian Ocean Islands, Mediterranean Basin, the Mountains of Central Asia, and Tropical Andes biodiversity hotspots. Investments in the Eastern Afromontane, Indo-Burma and Wallacea wrapped up during the fiscal year, while work was underway to update ecosystem profiles for Indo-Burma and Wallacea in anticipation of new investments. An updated ecosystem profile also was completed for the Caribbean Islands Biodiversity Hotspot while CEPF worked with the World Bank to map out a possible new investment in that hotspot.
