#### 2. Summarize the overall results/impact of your project

We find this project was so important and brought us a lot of valuable opportunities. GreenHub is a young organization, and we really needed to improve organizational skills prioritization of actions, clear strategy development, fundraising and communications and advocacy. This project provided us with the needed skills and opportunities for capacity building, including the process of developing a clear strategy for our organizational development and communication materials.

In the process of developing the strategy, we had opportunities to share our mission, vision and focus with partners and learn a lot from their experiences. Our partners (national and international) also found GreenHub to be very active and professional and to focus significant efforts on its organizational development in the start-up phase of the organization. Besides, the communication materials (annual reports, profile) were shared with partners and donors, hence they could know our activities and increased their confidence in our organization. This is one important factor for GreenHub's fund raising.

The project contributed significantly to our efforts of fund raising, from a small grant 20,000 USD from this project, GreenHub has received commiments from Donors up to 700,000 USD recently.

The project extension provided GreenHub with an opportunity to complete all the project products and submit them to the donors.

We assessed the advantages and disadvantages of all the database software that we know and found none of these suited our specific purpose and available resources. We also discussed with our website designer how to improve the website to include a database function. We found the link with website and database software to be quite feasible and effective, and finally decided that our website will have a function to be the database software as well.

#### **Lessons Learned**

8. Describe any lessons learned during the design and implementation of the project, as well as any related to organizational development and capacity building.

During the project implementation, GreenHub compiled key lesson learned as follows:

- Developing organizational strategy is a cycle of continuous improvement using a model of plan-do-check-act. GreenHub staff recently undertook an important step in the development of their new NGO. Over two workshops, staff members completed a Capacity Building Needs Assessment and Action Plan. The main objective of this activity was to help GreenHub to identify the strengths and weaknesses in their organizational capacity and to develop an improvement program to be delivered over the next year. The first session started with a brainstorming activity to help GreenHub get a broad collective understanding of their skills and knowledge gaps, and to identify each staff member's strengths. From this, the group then headed into a formal assessment using a capacity building needs assessment matrix that considered six elements of organizational capacity: Mission, Vision and Strategy; Governance and Leadership; Service Delivery and Impact; Resource Development; Strategic Relationships; and Internal Management and Operations. The current organisational capacity level was then ranked for each element and helped to identify the areas where there was a clear need to increase capacity. A number of opportunities for improvement were identified through this process. . The group then prioritized key capacity building focus areas that would have the greatest impact on the organization's capacity to achieve its mission and developed an action plan to address these areas. Once the action plan has been implemented, GreenHub will be able to increase their organizational capacity and see how much they have improved, and where to improve
- Diverse resources should be mobilized as part of a critical strategy of building organizational capacity. In this context we received support from the 3M impact programme, and PDC/USAID programme supporting young NGOs such like GreenHub. The CEPF Capacity Development Small Grant and other forms of capacity development are extremely important for GreenHub as a new NGO. Senior staff have considerable NGO experience in many parts of Viet Nam, in many thematic issues, and have many regional connections. In launching GreenHub as a new NGO, they are however now functioning in different leadership and management roles, with different mission responsibilities. They are also establishing, growing and structuring a new NGO
- In term of our project approach, GreenHub must focus on the core, organizational needs of GreenHub as a new, domestic NGO in Vietnam, focusing on the factors that, if addressed, can stimulate organizational growth in a professional and sustainable manner. These include: (i) The development, with experts advice and coaching of a clear national strategy based on credible information for GreenHub's programme of work, with feedback from stakeholders; (ii) The development of communications and fundraising plans to support this strategy; (iii) the development of one (1) local KBA-Level strategy (using Cat Ba; Vietnamese CEPF-KBA 23 as an example) with local community and protected area management participation to serve as an organizational development model and increase GreenHub programme effectiveness at local level and; (iv) Strengthening of GreenHub leadership skills

in the development of these products; (v) Developing priority-selected communication materials, especially our website for serve and introduce GreenHub to priority stakeholders and public. During the reporting period, an effective and proper approach has been deployed to interact with and evaluate experts' advice and coaching for a clear national strategy based on credible information for GreenHub's programme of work, with feedback from stakeholders. At least 8 high reputation advisers and partners gave GreenHub context information, advice and feedback for strategy, actions in context of Vietnam's development.

#### Concludsion:

In the first year of establishment, GreenHub provided individual consultancy packages in order to have funding for organization activities. Besides, GreenHub making efforts to build project proposals and construct of organizational development strategy. In June 2017, GreenHub for the first time received a "project" with a small budget from CEPF of 20,000 USD, but this was very significant, because most of these resources were devoted to building our organizational capacity and for the organization development.

Through the project, the Organization received the support of foreign experts, local experts, GreenHub's staff has been strengthened in terms of organizational structure and development. This support have helped GreenHub grow from a young organization (founded in 2016) out of the danger of dissolving as many new organizations do in their early stages.

GreenHub has completed a development strategy for the period 2018-2020 and vision to 2030, a fundraising strategy for the period 2018-2020 and an organizational manual. These strategies have helped GreenHub from resources of a few tens of thousands of dollars between 2017, GreenHub has received donor commitments of up to 700,000 USD recently. This achievement is the effort of GreenHub's leaders and staff, the support of advisers, partners and very important support from CEPF project.

#### Sustainability / Replication

9. Summarize the success or challenges in ensuring the project will be sustained or replicated, including any unplanned activities that are likely to result in increased sustainability or replicability.

Throughout the implementation of the project, GreenHub staff was strengthened in the fields of structure, organizational operations and the capacity to design and develop nature conservation projects.

- Enhancing competence in strategic organization planning and implementing to establish and develop the organization was prioritized. This stage is imperative to effectively initiate a systematized organization and sustainably innovate for it to grow.
- The staff participating in the project were the key officers of GreenHub, which therefore ensured the sustainability to build the organization in accordance with its mission.
- Through the project, GreenHub's staff enhanced their capacity in designing and developing nature conservation projects that are suitable to Vietnam's economic and political conditions.

- During the operation process, new personnel were exposed to the documents produced by this project from which they acquired information about the organization's strategy. This allowed them to understand the organization's approach and implement our targeted strategic activities.

Challenges in maintaining or replicating the project's outcome

Vietnam currently has several nature reserves and special-use areas including:

- 33 national parks
- 59 natural reserve areas
- 13 species conservation areas
- 9 biosphere reserves
- 54 landscape protection zones

Conservation planning for nature reserves often faces budget constraints, as the Vietnamese economy currently focuses on economic development. In addition, the conservation planning also confronts difficulties in human resources and the inconsistence of hierarchical managing system.

This has resulted in administrative staff being hesitant when it comes to executing the ultimate program for the protected areas, despite of its completely initiated strategy.
