This project has resulted in the formal establishment of a birdwatching civil society organization, and strengthened its capacity to carry out ecological protection activities in Guangxi. As a result it is now able to better advocate the public to know and protect wild species of flora and fauna.

A key result of this project has been the full legal registration of the Guangxi Birdwatching Society (GBS). As a result, this organization is now better able to carry out conservation activities, communicate with its network of volunteers, and access sources of funding. Another result of this project is an increase in the profile of the GBS among bird protection organizations in China. As a result, some of these organizations have assisted GBS in carrying out surveys of aquatic birds in parts of Guangxi.

Planned Long-term Impacts - 3+ years (as stated in the approved proposal):

The overall goal of the project was that "The Guangxi Birdwatching Society has the institutional strength to catalyze bird conservation activities in Guangxi province".

By completing legal registration of the organization, raising the profile of the organization among people interested in conservation in Guangxi, and organizing some pilot birdwatching, conservation, and awareness-raising activities, this project has made considerable progress towards its goal.

Component 1 Planned:

The Guangxi Bird-watching Society is legally registered, and functional.

To be achieved through the following activities:

- Prepare the necessary documents for legal registration of the society
- Submit registration documents to relevant authorities
- Purchase essential equipment for bird-watching and conservation activities.

Component 1 Actual at Completion:

The necessary documents were prepared for legal registration, and submitted. The organization is now legally registered by the Industry and Commerce Department as Guangxi Nanning bird-watching Society Culture Communication Co., Ltd.

The following essential equipment for bird-watching and conservation activities was purchased: 13 sets of Binoculars, 1 monocular; 1 tripod, 34 bird books, 2 computers, 2 office chairs, 1 backpack, 1 recording pen, 1 intercom, 2 microphones, and batteries.

Component 2 Planned:

The Guangxi Bird-watching Society is well known among those interested in bird conservation in Guangxi.

To be achieved through the following activities:

- Use online social media platforms to publicize the Guangxi Birdwatching Society to potential members and partners

- Prepare, print, and distribute and information brochure on threatened birds, and the work of the society

Component 2 Actual at Completion:

The Society is now active on relevant social media platforms (Blog, We chat, QQ group, etc.).

2000 copies of the brochure "Threatened and Protected Birds of Guangxi" were prepared, printed, and distributed to partners.

Component 3 Planned:

Through conservation action by the Guangxi Bird-watching Society, threats to bird species in Guangxi are significantly reduced.

To be achieved through the following activity:

- Organize bird-watching, conservation, and awareness-raising activities, including indoor lectures on bird conservation, and outdoor activities.

Component 3 Actual at Completion:

The following activities were held:

- Six outdoor bird-watching/promotion of bird conservation activities,
- One outdoor plant-watching activity,
- Two lectures on bird conservation.

Although it is not possible to say if these activities have led to a significant reduction of threats to birds in Guangxi, they have demonstrated that the Society is capable of leading such conservation efforts, and engaging with a large number of interested people to promote bird conservation in Guangxi.
