1. What was the initial objective of this project?

- a) To make newly compiled information on the terrestrial and freshwater ecoregions of Africa, including the eastern African coastal forests and Eastern Arc Mountains, available to key management agencies in the region
- b) To make available copies of the 'Eastern Arc Mountains' Special Issue of the JEANHS (published in 1998) to key management agencies in the region.

2. Did the objectives of your project change during implementation? If so, please explain why and how.

No, the objectives did not change during implementation.

3. How was your project successful in achieving the expected objectives?

We distributed 216 books here in the East African region and a further 48 were distributed in the U.S.A, with the expected net effect of:

- -Increased availability of information on the ecoregions of Africa, including coastal forests and Eastern Arc Mountains, in the countries where they are found and will lead to better management decisions that affect the conservation of these forests as well as the freshwater resources.
- -Encouraging further research to target poorly known areas or to assess changes in forest and biodiversity status since the data for these two books was compiled.

4. Did your team experience any disappointments or failures during implementation? If so, please explain and comment on how the team addressed these disappointments and/or failures.

There was a delay in the acquisition of the **Eastern Arc Mountains' Special Issue of the JEANHS (published in 1998)** owing to unavailability of the same in the region, these were finally sourced from The National Museums of Kenya at the end of August 2006.

5. Describe any positive or negative lessons learned from this project that would be useful to share with other organizations interested in implementing a similar project.

Key management agencies have a dearth of literature in their resource rooms that can be used for research purposes by staff and students alike. Where possible, similar projects need to be undertaken to ameliorate this situation.
